- Tim Ohm moved to approve the meeting minutes, which was seconded by Mary Yank. The motion passed.


Treasurer's Report

Advocacy

- Robust discussion with all present regarding advocacy at the district level to bring back individual lessons in the younger grades, reintroduce instrument/ensemble opportunities at the elementary schools, provide educator positions to fulfill these endeavors. The historical changes (2018, stopping lessons, move to start band/choir/orchestra in 6th grade instead of 5th grade, limiting elective opportunities at the middle school by moving from 7 class periods to 6, economic inequities of parents having to choose private lessons for students to have a real chance at performing to grade level in ensembles.
- Brainstorming ways to increase parent involvement both in advocacy and volunteer hours
 - Having UMPS meetings at FPMS
 - Themed meetings strategically throughout the year (inviting 6th grade parents in the fall to field questions prior to student making course choices for the next academic year)
 - Videos of parent/student testimonials of the benefits of their music education experience in Franklin.
 - Utilizing district and community resources to communicate call for volunteers for WSMSA solo ensemble.
